The question of death, and what happens when one dies, are questions that have intrigued mankind since the very dawn of time. Even today, with significant advances in technology, medicine, and science, the question of the mystery of death remains entirely unanswered. Truth be told, science is ill equipped to deal adequately with the issue of death. Death is more than the ceasing of physiological functions and activities. It has mental, emotional, and certainly spiritual ramifications both for the dying and for those who remain. The Bible, the Holy Scriptures, contains the keys that unlock this mystery. Answers to questions about death are found in the Bible. The Bible alone can illumine the dark door of death.

The story of the raising of Lazarus, found in John 11, is one of the clearest stories in the Bible concerning death. Note first of all that Jesus Himself refers to death as a "sleep." The disciples did not understand Jesus' reference, so He then told them "plainly, Lazarus is dead," in John 11:11-14. When Jesus later encounters Martha, Lazarus' sister. notice carefully what she says about her brother's resurrection. She says it will occur "at the last day," v. 24. We might legitimately ask the question: What did Martha believe about death? The answer is simple: She believed that death was a temporary state of unconsciousness that would be ended by the "resurrection at the last day." This is exactly what the Scriptures teach.
